Etched Patterns:



A pair of crystal No. 2375 Shakers with glass lids in the June pattern (plate etching No. 279) sold for \$30.00 plus \$10.85 shipping. The Shakers were in good condition with no damage. Long & Seate (*Fostoria Tableware 1924-1943*, p. 177) give production dates for the Shakers in crystal of 1928 to 1943. Three bidders placed three bids in the sale with an opening price of \$24.00.



A pair of No. 2375 Candlesticks with plate etching No. 278, Versailles, sold for \$20.00 plus \$12.05 shipping. Seller's description: "You are viewing a pair of Vintage 1928 Fostoria elegant glass Versailles etch Candle Holders in Azure Blue. These candle holders measure about 3½-inches tall and about 4½-inches diameter at the base. They are in very good to excellent condition. No chips, cracks, or repairs. The Candlesticks were produced in azure from 1928 to 1939 (Long & Seate, *Fostoria Tableware 1924-1943*, p. 169.) There was one bidder for the Candlesticks.



A Mayonnaise bowl with the Oriental plate etching (No. 250) sold for \$28.00 plus \$13.46 shipping. Description: "This listing is for a Fostoria Glass #2138 Footed Mayonnaise Bowl with the "Oriental" etching consisting of birds and flowers. It stands 4 3/8 inches tall and is 5 5/8 across the top rim. It is in very good pre-owned condition with no nicks, chips, cracks or staining. The glass is clean and clear. There are minimal light surface scratches here and there that are commensurate with a piece of glass nearly 100 years old that has been used. There is a slight "crease" in one spot along the top rim. . . that was done during the manufacturing process and is not post-production damage." Long & Seate (Fostoria Tableware 1924-1943, p. 140), state "The Oriental design is possibly the most elaborate of all the Fostoria etchings. One wishes that it could have come into being a decade later so that it would have been offered as a complete dinner service. The crystal is of the finest, thin-blown glass, with each piece a marvel of delicacy." It was made from 1918 to 1928. Three bidders placed seven bids in the auction where the opening bid was \$6.50.

Other:



In time for the holidays, this Sleigh sold for \$14.50 plus \$9.75 shipping. The seller noted: "This Fostoria glass sleigh is about 4 inches across the top and about 2 1/4 in. high and in good condition. It has a light blue tint. It has the original made in U.S.A. sticker." The opening bid was \$9.99, and three bidders placed six bids in the sale.



A No. 2750 Hapsburg Crown Candy Jar with Cover in gold sold for \$29.99 plus \$10.51 shipping. Description: "Fostoria Royal Hapsburg Crown Collection yellow glass Covered Candy Dish. In good used condition. No cracks or breaks. Dish shows minor nicks on inner lip of lid, from use &/or storage. Dish measures 5 1/4" wide at top of crown, 4" wide at inner rim (opening) & 5 3/4" tall with lid." Long & Seate (*Fostoria Tableware 1944-1986*, p. 247) note that the piece was made in gold from 1961 to 1965. There was one bid placed in the auction.



This green No. 2373 Window Vase with Cover sold for \$158.50 plus \$10.51 shipping. The seller described the item as follows: "Fostoria green glass Window Box. 8" wide, 4 3/4" tall with frog in place. The box is in perfect condition with no chips, cracks, scratches or flea bites and the glass is very clear. The flower frog has two flea bites and a bubble on one end. There are light scratches on the inner surface of the frog, only seen when held to the light and probably caused by any branches inserted. Perfect for display during the coming holidays." There were six bids placed by three bidders in the auction with a starting price of \$135.00. Long & Seate (Fostoria Useful and Ornamental, 2000, p. 205) note the green Vases were made from 1928 to 1932.

American Pattern:



A Shrimp and Dip Bowl in the No. 2056 American pattern sold for \$147.50 plus \$14.63 shipping. Seller's description: "Offered is this beautiful vintage Fostoria American Shrimp Bowl Chip & Dip Dish Tray Platter in the cube pattern. This is (one piece) with the tray and dish combined. It measures about 13 inches across and 4½ inches tall. Excellent original condition - no chips or cracks." Seligson (Fostoria American, 2nd ed. 1994, p. 30) gives production dates for the Shrimp and Dip of 1959 to 1974. The opening bid in the auction was \$59.99, and nine bidders placed 21 bids for the Bowl.



Description: "We are pleased to offer this rare American Fostoria Glass - canary yellow - square 5¾" Perfume Cologne Bottle for sale. The bottle measures 2¼ inches wide and 5¾ inches high. There is a small chip on the stopper." Seligson (p. 34) states that the Perfume Bottle was made from 1924 to 1944, and that the canary yellow color was made from 1925 to 1926 (p. 78). There was one bid for the Bottle.



An American Cream Soup sold for \$19.99 plus \$13.00 shipping. The seller stated that it was in excellent condition with no chips, cracks, or signs of wear. There was one bid in the auction. Seligson (p. 28) notes that the Cream Soup was made from 1938 to 1958, and he gives it a rarity rank of "rare."

Pressed Patterns:



A Cream and Sugar with cover in the No. 2806 Pebble Beach pattern sold for \$104.06 with free shipping. The set was in the black pearl color. The seller noted the items were in "excellent condition with no chips or damage," and they appeared to be unused. Long & Seate note in *Fostoria Tableware 1944-1986* (1999, p. 101) that the pattern was made from 1969 to 1970. There were four bidders who placed seven bids in the auction. The opening price was \$29.99.



Three bidders placed 11 bids on this emerald green Urn in the No. 1372, Coin, pattern. The final selling price was \$52.50 plus \$12.75 shipping. The seller described it as a vase: "Fostoria deep green glass Vase 10" [with a] liberty, eagle, torch lid. Various uses...Candy, notes, sentimental. Kept in great condition. They just don't make things like this as good as this anymore. Used, as is. Please enjoy!!" Long & Seate (Fostoria Tableware 1944-1986, p. 13) note that the Urn was made in emerald green in 1963-1964.




This Decanter Set in the Hermitage pattern (No. 2449) in topaz color sold for a buy-it-now price of \$249.99 plus \$15.59 shipping. The set consisted of a Decanter and Stopper and five 2-ounce Tumblers. The seller described it as a "hard to find set" with no chips or cracks. Long & Seate (*Fostoria Tableware 1924-1943*, 1999, p. 79) note that the Decanter was made in topaz from 1932 to 1938. They also note that items in the Hermitage pattern were often sold in sets (p. 78). "The idea of sets no doubt arose from the influx of bar ware after the repeal of Prohibition. Fostoria extended the idea of mixing colors with the Rainbow Assortments offered in those sets." Although this set was all one color and it included five tumblers, Long & Seate (p. 82) note the Decanter Set originally included six 2-ounce tumblers.

The board of directors of FGSA will be working on developing a policy to cover the donations of Fostoria Glassware to the museum. This is one suggestion that will be discussed at our next Board of Directors meeting. When a final draft is completed we will posted it in the Facets

Here's an update to the procedures for donating glass to the Fostoria Museum. Donation are always highly appreciated and donation slips are always in a basket in the kitchen area of the museum.

First, decide if you are a Federal taxpayer who is likely to itemize their deductions. If you are not an itemizer, you may not care if you receive a written letter from Fostoria acknowledging your donation. If you tell us that, it will mean a lot less work for our museum staff. If you are in category number one, we won't send you an acknowledgement letter, unless you request one. Please fill out a donation slip if you wish to have credit in the museum system for your donation.

Second, if you are an itemizer, you will need to keep your own careful records of what you have purchased and subsequently donate to the museum. When you bring us items to donate to the museum, you will need to fill out a donation slip for the item and include all of the identifier information that you have to help us log in your donation; things like names, line numbers, sizes, colors etc. help us to create a good record for the museum. If you are in the second category and you request an acknowledgement on the donation slip, we will send you an acknowledgement letter with a general listing of the items you have given, such as blue pitcher or set of American dinnerware. It will be up to you to attach a copy of your own more comprehensive list of your donated items and the costs you assign to them. The two lists should be stapled together and kept safely with your tax materials.

Third, if you have some special conditions like "on loan" you need to note those on the donation slip. If your donation is in the third category, you will fill in the donation slip and clearly mark it as a loan. Follow the rest of the procedure for the second category. Expect to also receive our form for a loaned item which you will have to fill-out, sign and return to the museum for the loan to be valid.

IRS rules are such that the museum can not participate in valuing any of your glassware. There are some books in our glass library that suggest values, but you are responsible to choose and be prepared to defend any values that you take as tax deductions.

It has been a huge headache when folks who kindly donate, bring in boxes of glassware with absolutely no information attached on or in the box. From this point forward, any glassware brought and left in that condition will be considered "donated unconditionally". That means the museum is free to use the glassware as they see fit, for museum, for sale, or for auction use, etc. The museum staff will not add to their gray hairs trying to figure out who brought in what. Its not a lack of appreciation, just a lack of time and prioritization of effort.




